BACK PAIN -ABOUT ELLEN

Ellen has a history of intractable back pain for over 15 years. She has tried other forms of typical clinical physical therapy, without much success. With a morphine pump and neuro stimulator implants, she reported that she still was going through her everyday life with a pain level of "7/10". Earlier this year she found Renaissance Healing and Learning Center. While she was visiting a store called Marin Tack and Feed in Fairfax, the owner recommended RHLC. She saw the literature revealing possibilities of "healing on horseback" at Renaissance.

Ellen now has been participating in hippotherapy sessions twice weekly, with Fran the Physical Therapist and her team, which includes the horse Stormy, volunteers and staff. The results were immediate, not altogether surprising, but significant. Her pain level reduced from "7/10" to "5/10" by the end of the first session. Since then, she reports that while the pain is still a major issue in her life, she has been able to increase her activity level, on a day-by-day basis. The pain level has reduced to as low as "2/10" after hippotherapy

Another remarkable feature of rehabilitation through hippotherapy has been not only a significant change in her posture but it also has helped her depression. Initially we saw her walking as if she was a solid block, precariously moving through space, as if the slightest movement might cause her to break like a glass, forward, bent-over, looking at the ground. Now "1 am enjoying life more than ever", she says. Ellen now walks with head high, looking straight ahead, with a straighter back and a smile.




STORMY......GLISTENING BLACK COAT, SHINING BLACK MANE.....


